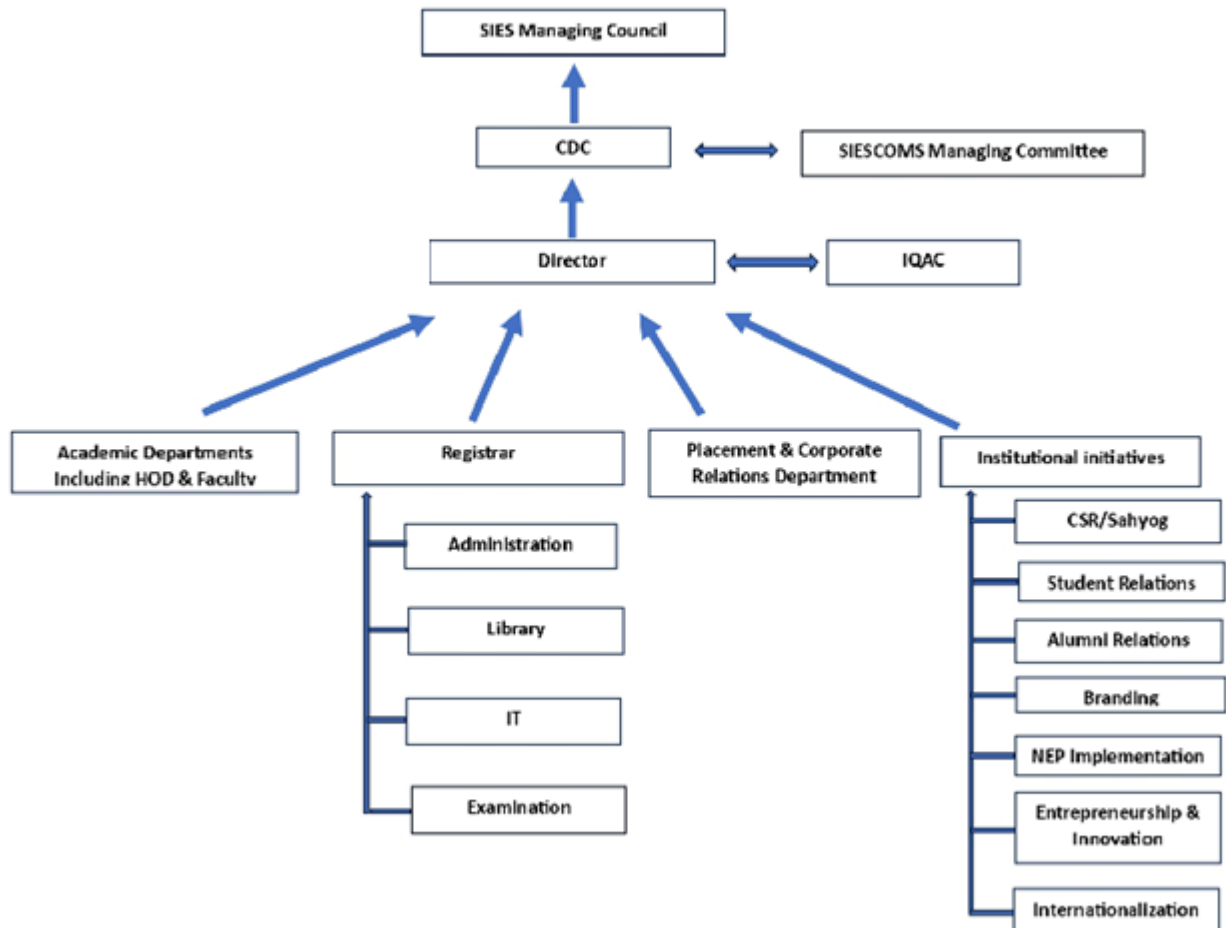

Nature and extent of involvement of faculty and students in academic affairs / improvements:
