

INTRODUCTION:

On the occasion of the 75th Independence Day we the CSR Sahyog committee had organized a short role play on 15th August 2022 at our college campus as a part of the Independence Day celebration event. The role play was organized with the aim of creating an awareness regarding the disposal of our national flag with respect and dignity. Due to lack of knowledge with respect to the disposal of our national flag we had thrown light upon the Flag code section 5 article 3.25. The spread of this message not only did help the audience be aware about the disposal of the flag but also helped in understanding the importance of respecting the flag with dignity.

Further, the committee had arranged for two flag drop-box at the campus from 15th August'22 to 19th August'22 in order to drop in the soiled flags which would then be taken care by the committee with due respect. Later, there was prize distribution conducted for the winners for various competition organized by the CSR Sahyog committee and lastly distribution of the NGO internship winners had been felicitated by the Chief guest of honor and their NGO mentor.

METHODOLOGY:

Flag Code message would generally be carried out by communicating the spread of message through several virtual messages as well as putting up of the flyers within our campus vicinity. The process began by being mentored under the guidance of our very own alumni, followed by the brain storming session to come up with an idea for executing the event. It also included several meetings in order to come up with the idea for role play, to analyse the positioning of the flag drop box and in preparation of self-explanatory flyers to be put up in the campus. In order to reach out to people in large numbers and spread the message across our team had come up with an online message which had been circulated to everyone in the college via Email or Whatsapp platform. The event took place on 15th August 2022 as a part of the Independence Day celebration.

THE PROCESS:

15th August 2022

Firstly, began with a brief introduction of our Guest in honor which later on followed by highlighting the difference between flag hoisted on 15th August and 26th January. The



importance of the flag was mentioned along with the theme "Har Ghar Tiranga" on the occasion of 75th Independence Day.

Further, it was handed over to our committee members in order to present a short role play regarding conveying the message of flag code and the initiative taken by the CSR Sahyog committee for arranging the flag drop box for all the soiled flags.

INTRODUCTION:

Organ Donation Awareness Day is celebrated on 13th of August each year. Organ donation day is observed every year on 13th of August. Due to lack of awareness, there is myth and fear among people. The aim of this day is to motivate human beings to donate organs after death and to spread awareness about the importance of organ donation. Our donor can save up to 8 lives through organ donation and heal up to 50 lives through tissue donation. Organ Donation is life giving opportunity for those who are on end line of hope. It carries the power to enhance the lives of people and change them forever.

METHODOLOGY:

Last year's awareness campaign for organ donation was handled exclusively online. The three-day organ donation awareness campaign this year took place on the SIES campus and was held totally offline. Once the lockdown was lifted and students resumed their offline classes, these events were a huge success. Around 175-200 students took part in these events. The activities took place on August 22nd, 23rd, and 25th, 2022.



LEARNINGS:

Without a doubt, the most important takeaway from this exercise was the influence of a person's decision to donate their organs and tissues after death. We learned some startling figures, such as the fact that just 3% of those who could have been spared through organ donation survive. Another fascinating fact is that one donor can save up to 8 lives through organ donation and improve up to 50 lives through tissue donation. These are very inspiring individuals because they represent actual people who may be given a second chance at life. Donating organs can aid in the grieving process. Then the oath was taken by the members. Vatsal recited the oath and members were repeating after him.





Posters were circulated all over the groups by 6 pm in the evening, along with the registration link for the event.






Day 2- 26th January 2023




Day 5- 29th January 2023

Cancer posters were shared and circulated by the committee members in the classrooms. And also coordinated with the CR's of the respected classrooms to promote the event.






Day 7 to Day 10 - 31st January to 3rd Feburary

INTRODUCTION:

SIES School of Business Studies have integrated research in course curriculum and try to come out with working papers to inculcate learning beyond textbooks in minds of students. Students at SIES School of Business Studies are encouraged to take internships with NGOs as this would bring social sensitivity among them. SIES School of Business Studies believe management education is all about holistic development in one's personality and awareness beyond classroom and corporate world.

An NGO internship program is a part of curriculum at SIES School of Business Studies offered by non-governmental organizations (NGOs) that provides individuals with an opportunity to work with the organization for a specific period of time, typically a few weeks. The purpose of an NGO internship is to provide individuals with hands-on experience in the operations of an NGO and to expose them to the organization's mission and work by contributing to the society.

NGOs work in a variety of fields, such as human rights, education, health, environment, and poverty reduction. During an NGO internship, individuals may assist with research, advocacy, fundraising, event planning, or other tasks related to the organization's work.

METHODOLOGY:

NGO Assignment:

CSR Sahyog Committee began by spreading the information about NGO internships. Students were then instructed to form groups of 4-6 people based on their preferred location and line of work, and to enter the names of these group members into the excel file generated by the CSR Sahyog Committee. Students who were not from Mumbai were given the opportunity to intern at an NGO in their native city.

The CSR Sahyog Committee then assigned these groups to an NGO depending on their preferred location or area of interest, whatever was most convenient for the students. Following the NGO assignment, students were expected to write a letter of application and receive approval from the professor in charge, Dr. Surekha Durga.



NGO Internship Completion:

After completing their NGO internship, students were asked to fill out an excel sheet containing the names of their group members and the project assigned by the NGO.

Following completion, each group was required to present their work and internship experience to an internal and external jury for performance evaluation, with the best group being awarded the best NGO internship group.

The CSR Sahyog Committee allocated each group a jury and class for the presentations based on the project title.
